- Community meeting rooms
- Victim recovery rooms
- Traffic Office
- Power and Water storage to independently supply stations for up to three days in the event of emergencies
- Access for differently abled persons
- Parking

Amenities for Officers:

- Lecture rooms
- Offices
- Library
- Gymnasium
- Dormitories - male and female
- Private Quarters
- Kitchen
- Laundry room
- Prayer room
- Private office for counselling
